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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 30 September 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 September 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and activities

The aims as per paragraph 2 of The British Phycological Society constitution (2012) are as follows:

"The aims of the Society shall be to advance research and education by the encouragement and pursuit of all aspects of the study of algae and to publish the results of this research in a journal, and also in other publications which shall from time to time appear desirable, provided that all publications of the Society shall be available to the general public. In furtherance of those aims, but not otherwise, the Society shall also aim to increase public awareness of the importance and applications of algae, and to contribute to public debate on issues involving algae."

In addition, the constitution states that:

"All funds acquired by the Society shall be devoted to the aims detailed in paragraph 2 above or to such associated charitable projects as may from time to time further these aims."

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

To this end, the BPS has continued to give financial support to activities that promote phycological research, disseminate phycological knowledge at all levels from governmental advice to community projects, in particular by assisting young phycologists to present their findings at scientific meetings nationally and internationally.

In 2019 the 67th Annual meeting was hosted by SAMS Oban Argyll UK. Our thanks go to local organizers Claire Gachon and Christine Campbell and their team for organizing a very successful and varied meeting which took on the successful format that had been used in the previous year. The Manton Session was well attended, and congratulations go to Suzana Gonçalves Leles, whose excellent presentation on the Biogeography of mixotrophic plankton in the oceans: global patterns, sampling bias and the role of diversity earned her the Manton Prize. The Manton poster prize was awarded to Carla Greco for her poster. 5 students received support of £2,509 to attend this BPS meeting and 6 students received awards of £8,958 to attend other meetings from the Scientific Meetings Fund. The Hilda Canter Lund awards for photography was presented to Zoe Loffler: Symphony of seaweeds showing amazing variety and wonderful colours of seaweeds that was taken at low tide near Apollo Bay, Victoria, Australia , and to Damien Sirjacobs: Blue haze A bloom of benthic blue diatoms of the genus Haslea (H. ostrearia, H. provincialis) covering macroalgae communities (Padina pavonica, Acetabularia acetabulum, Halopteris scoparia, Dictyota sp.) in the shallow water of Calvi Bay (Corsica, France).

The Society received 23 applications for funding in this financial year and was able to support 18 student members to develop and present their phycological knowledge both in the UK and abroad by attending conferences, meetings and courses. The small grant/project award received 7 applications and 2 awards were made of £3,092. Work was commissioned to update the BPS Logo and the cost for year end 2019 was £2,500. The special project, an open-access educational and research resource titled A Diatom Flora of Britain and Ireland continued its work, costing the society £576 in the year to end 30th September 2019.

The Society journal, European Journal of Phycology (EJP) continued to have a productive year, with 4 issues and 648 pages produced as part of Volume 54. The impact factor of the EJP continues to increase, with the IF for the journal in the year end 2019 reaching 2.562 with 148 new submissions and a turnover of 228 papers handled in the 12-month period. This is part of a steady increase in IF since 2014. It is noted that due to rising IF in other journals EJP is still just Q1 in Marine and Freshwater Biology and continues to be Q2 in Plant Sciences. The BPS has invested in a new Journal, Applied Phycology which have attracted submissions from around the world. There had been 21 submissions to the journal with four accepted for publication. A planned special Issue 'Algal collections in the -omics age' have attracted five submissions with more expected.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

A full statement of financial activities of The British Phycological Society for the year ending 30th September 2019 are presented in addition to this annual trustees' report. The financial statement has been prepared by Dr. Nicky JD Slee and independently examined by the Independent Examiner.

BPS income for 2019 was £47,147, with the majority coming from the Society's journal profit share from publishers Taylor and Francis £42,861. In addition, net income from subscriptions from members made up £3,455 of this total. The remainder of the income for 2019 came from interest on deposits held £831.

Total Society expenditure for 2019 amounted to £60,163, broken down into four categories which included: 1) Grants, studentships and awards £15,786; see some specific details in Achievements and Performance above), 2) Publication expenditure £23,806, Meetings and Committee expenses £7,472 and 4) Administration costs £13,099.

Publication expenditure costs can be further broken down into production and publication/distribution costs for the European Journal of Phycology, as well as for the Society newsletter, The Phycologist. EJP cost £5,057 in production and distribution, with editorial expenses at £15,234 to coordinate authors, reviewers, sub-editors and publishers to produce 4 issues of the journal annually. Costs to set up and pay for editorial expenses were £1,500 The remainder of EJP costs £341 include management committee costs travel expenses for an annual trip for up to four members to discuss EJP/publisher developments with Taylor and Francis. The Phycologist was produced and distributed for £1,674.

Meetings and Committee expenses were £7,472 with reimbursement for travel and overnight accommodation, hire of rooms to allow council members to attend summer council meetings costing £4,500. Annual meeting costs, general expenses and expenses from committee members attending internal and external events made up the remainder of the £2,972 spent.

Finally, administration costs of £13,099 to run the Society for 2019 included charges for website maintenance, sponsorship of Algaebase advertising, banking, public liability insurance, the independent examiners of the accounts, subscriptions to the Federation of European Microbiological Societies and Federation of European Phycological Societies. Honoraria were awarded to the following council members: Membership Secretary, Secretary, Webmaster and the Editor of The Phycologist each received £1,000, the Treasurer received £1,250.

Net deficit for the BPS in 2019 was £14,312. After including funds brought forward (held in reserve as savings) of £170,834 the total Society funds carried forward at the end of financial year 2019 is £156,522. Therefore, the Society's financial situation remains very healthy and this has allowed the continued support of a wide range of projects and awards dedicated to algal research. The Society does not currently have a reserves policy in place, however work is in progress to develop one for approval by the trustees for the future.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
